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**27** Faculty recharging strategies (UGC, ASC, Refresher / orientation programs, workshops, training programs and similar programs).

- Dr. Anandi Patel is a Master Trainer for the UGC's scheme of capacity building of women manager in higher education at the national level. She has organised following recharging programmes aided by UGC:
  - One State level sensitisation workshop was organised for capacity building of women managers in higher education. This workshop was for women manager (HoD, Principle and Registrar etc.) the aim was to raise gender sensitivity and motivating them to take managerial role and providing them management related knowledge and skill. 28 participants (Senior Professors) participated.
  - One ToT workshop for the scheme of capacity building of women managers in higher education was organised. The aim was to select state wise potential trainer for Gujarat, Maharashtra and Rajasthan .18 senior level professors participated. The Ex. Chairperson of UGC Prof. Armaiti Desai remained present and guided the participants.
- Dr. Manoj Parmar- One day workshop on Writing Skill was organised for the lecturers of state level social work colleges of Gujarat (22 lecturers participated).

**28** Student projects :

- In-house project on thalassemia in collaboration with the help of Red Cross society, social work student did one project on Thalassemia. The doctor have given information regarding blood related disease and problem, need of blood testing and blood donation to our 500 students. Then they organised blood test camp on 1 February 2012 for the entire college student. Total 168 (140 girls and 28 boys) students got their blood tested. The blood test results reveal that out of 168 tests, 15 students found to have sickle-cell and 3 students had Thalassemia minor. The students who were thalassemia minor were counselled by the doctor and our faculty. They aware made aware as what care should needed at the time of marriage and future life.
- The student of social work did a project for slum dwellers children of Shahpur, Ahmedabad. Every day in morning or evening and Sunday they went there and taught the children who were not going to schools. They motivated them and due to

their efforts, 10 slum children were admitted in school. Also they organised health camps and sanitation programmes to activate municipal health centre and sanitation department.

  - Student started day care centre at Nirma University: Students of Nirma University came to our department for the placement in child helpline. They were sensitised regarding child rights during working with our child helpline coordinator. At that time they saw the children of construction worker were playing at the site at Nirma plant in very risky condition. So they decided to start day care centre. But they did not have any knowledge for this activity. Though the help of social work students they started day care centre. This way they set the example for both the university.

**48** Give details of “beyond syllabus scholarly activities” of the department :

- Social work is a practice-bases subject, so our main activities, innovations are in field Exposure. Our students doing their field work in villages with very commitment. Looking to their commitment, in three villages’ Panchayat donated land to establish extension centre to do the regular activity for the village people. We have established two extension centres in Gota and Thaltej. In the village Singarwa due to students and faculties intervention, private land for primary school was donated by a villager.
- In the peoples movement, we have given contribution, support to the movement through the participation and research work. Where as an outsider we gave moral support to the villagers and their movement. Such movements are as under-
  - 2008 Protest movement against the establishment of nuclear power station at Meethivirdi.
  - 2010-Protest movement against the Nirma factory established at Mahuwa.
  - 2014- Protest movement of farmers losing their lands against the bypass of Junagadh.
- As our experienced professor in the field of counselling we are selected for the training centre for HIV/AIDS counselling in Gujarat out of 36 centres in country. This project is ongoing since last five years which is Global fund for HIV/Aids Tuberculosis and malaria. Our faculties are experts in this field and rendering their services as a trainer, and counselling supervisors.
- In Gujarat we are the first partner for setting child line in Ahmedabad. Our Significant contribution in establishing this programme to set model, influence policies and programmes.
- Faculties have published ten books in Gujarati.

- Every year we get 'A' grade in GFATM project.
- Gujarat Vidyapeeth is awarded by Gujarat State AIDS Control Society for its contribution efforts as erstwhile partner in prevention and control of HIV/AIDS.

50 Briefly highlight the contributions of the department in generating new knowledge, basic or apply :

- We have introduced the course of Gandhian approach of social work. We have tried to integrate the professional social work with Gandhian social work. We are giving the exposure to the students to Gandhi's non-violent social action method through participation in movement and *padyatras*.
- Our focus is in teaching and field work geared towards the marginalised groups, so our student also become more sensitive and ready to work at grassroots.
- Faculty has written 10 books in Gujarati, we are teaching in Gujarati, so it is our contribution towards knowledge generation.
- Four Ph.D. thesis is published as a book; all the topics are very relevant and created new knowledge in social work.
- In the world there is big challenge against social work profession that the profession evolve and develop at the UK and US. So there is big challenge develop in other century in their different situation. We have tried very little experiment to indigenisation the social work profession, mainly through the field work.
- M.Phil. and Ph.D. students also select the topics regarding the marginalise people and it is our contribution.
- Faculty member delivered their lectures, training, workshop mostly in the area of Dalit, Muslims, children and women, on the base of their research and expertise.
- Through our two projects- child helpline and GFATM around 7 counselling component we have trained many counsellors and child rights worker. In child helpline we set many examples in intervention works and influence the allied systems policies and programmes.



- We have contributed some courses as a model for the state level universities.
- \* Development of Dalit -Adivasi community
- \* Gandhian approach to social work
- \* Setu programme-orientation programme
- Department has contributed in the training of family counsellors of counselling centres aide by GSSWB, particularly in identifying the agencies for this programme, assessment and recommendation to the CSWB for the grant, regarding the training of counsellor-preparing agenda and selecting resource persons and taking sessions.

**51** Detail five major Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges (SWOC) of the Department:

**Strengths:**

- Working hours and working days are comparatively more.
- Because of less number of students we have personal contact with each of our students.
- Our education is more reality-based and value-based.
- Our priority is to prepare rural students to work in any rural area.
- To learn Gandhian philosophy and tried to living with Gandhian value is our strength.

**Weaknesses:**

- Less contribution in research by the faculty.
- Less participation and organisation of national and international seminar/workshops.
- Less use of ICT by students as they have language barriers.
- Because of Gujarati medium, we are not getting the faculty from the out state.
- Even though students and teacher have good grassroots exposure we could not develop field action projects.

**Opportunities:**

- As a small university and department we are getting chance to participate in different programme.
- The management is not intervening in the departmental programme.

- Management always inspire and approved to the faculty for the development like sabbatical live etc.

**Challenges:**

- Society's expectation is very high against the universities we believes in Gandhian values. Also we face difficulty to give justice as a professional course.
- We give priority to the students from rural and weaker section; it is great challenge to uplift them and main streaming them.
- Due to lack of resources, extension centres could not be developed.
- Mostly the social work literature is in English so some faculty and students face difficulties.

**52 Future plans of the Department :**

- To make efforts to involve faculties in minor, major research projects
- To reapply for the SAP, as once our proposal was not approved by the UGC, due to lack of required strength of faculty.
- To develop field action programme in the area like adolescent girls, addiction in Children and youths, child sexual abuse etc.
- To prepare education material for the field work.
- To develop quality assurance indicators and assess ourselves.
- To organise national level workshops, seminars and also more faculties attend national, International seminars.
- We always think about different identity in social work profession as an department of Gandhian Institute, we did a little, but should have more expectation from ourselves.
- To develop two extension centre as a field laboratory, try to get resources from UGC.
- To strengthen alumni association and get their involvement in the development of departmental academic activities.
- Faculties are keen to publish one social work journal in Gujarati.
- As we are teaching in Gujarati, it is required social work literature in Gujarati, our faculty has written some books but more efforts are required
